MORE ABOUT THE SUMMER DANCE INTENSIVE Spanning six weeks in June and July 2009, th

Spanning six weeks in June and July 2009, the NC State Dance Program hosted its first summer dance intensive—providing undergraduate and graduate students of all majors the opportunity to study modern and post-modern dance technique and participate in the creation of a professional dance work over the summer months. The intensive was led by Dance Program assistant director Autumn Mist Belk, who was joined by dancers from the Raleigh-based multimedia dance group, Code f.a.d. Company. The company members served as assistant teachers and mentors to the students, as the company and students danced side-by-side in technique classes and throughout the creation of Code f.a.d.'s newest evening-length work, *Indulge*.

In all, eighteen students participated during the intensive, with eight students completing the program and performing in an informal showing on July 26, presenting several sections of *Indulge*. The showing was held in the Carmichael Dance Studio and was attended by the students' friends and families. Two program participants, Catherine Buell and Ashley Walls (senior in mathematics), were asked to continue training through August and September with Code f.a.d. Company and will perform with the group in the premiere of *Indulge* on October 14 & 15 at Duke University's Reynolds Industries Theatre.
